Overview of Programs

Early Years Child and Family Centres

Free programs for children ages 0 – 6 and their parents/ caregivers, which focuses on healthy childhood growth, development and early literacy programs.

Kindergarten

Kindergarten is a play-based purposeful learning program for 4 and 5 year olds. Kindergarten is offered in all DDSB elementary schools.

Before & After School Programs

The DDSB and community agencies/partners offer a range of child care and before and after school programs for children ages 4 – 12.

After School Recreation Programs

The DDSB and community agencies/partners offer affordable after school recreation programs for children ages 6 – 12 in a fun, safe, interesting and engaging environment.

Child Care Centres In Schools

Qualified, licensed Child Care Operators provide child care for 0 – 4 year olds (ages vary per site).

Nursery/Preschool Programs

The DDSB and community agencies/partners offer nursery school programs in schools for children 2 to 4 years of age. Early Childhood Educators deliver developmentally appropriate activities two or three half days per week, helping young learners prepare for school.

Welcome To Kindergarten (WTK)

Pre-school children (entering Kindergarten in DDSB schools the following September) and their families are provided with the resources to begin their formal education with a foundation in early learning nurtured in their homes. Families receive a bag of resources to facilitate the transfer of learning activities to the home.

School Readiness Programs

School Readiness Programs support children and families with the transition into Kindergarten. These programs are free and focus on the development domains of 3 and 4 year-old children

DDSB Continuing Education - Care for Newcomer Children (CNC)

CNC provides care for newcomer children while their parents are receiving language and settlement services.

Supporting Children with Special Needs

Child Care partners work with Resources for Exceptional Children and Youth.
