## Starting kindergarten is an exciting milestone for you and your child!

Your child's communication and social skills are important for building relationships, learning, playing, and interacting with others at school.

There are many ways to communicate. Some languages are spoken (e.g., Hindi, English), and some are signed (e.g., American Sign Language). Communication can also include facial expressions, gestures, pictures, and technology (e.g., speech generating devices).

We recognize and honour that children enter kindergarten with their own experiences, backgrounds, and ways of communicating and that each child will develop skills over time at their own rate.

Hearing and vision are also important for learning and can change over time! Consider having your child's hearing and vision checked before school starts. This is especially important if your child:

- has had a history of repeated and/or chronic ear infections,
- speaks loudly or often asks people to repeat
- squints, closes or covers one eye when looking at objects
- · frequently rubs or touches their eyes
